

WHAT KIND OF TRAINING IS PROVIDED?

Employer paid training will be provided throughout your career! Your current level of experience will determine how many hours of training you'll need each year – both on the job (OJT) and in the classroom.

To move from one IJ level to the next, you must have at least 1,680 on the job hours each year. Classroom training hours (10 hours to 160 hours) increase with your years of experience. Once all the requirements are met for an IJ-8, you can upgrade to a Journeyman.

WHAT WILL YOUR CAREER PATH LOOK LIKE WITH US?

You will be evaluated to identify an appropriate starting classification of Intermediate Journeyman (IJ). You need at least one year of documented experience in the electrical construction industry. There are a total of 8 levels.

Throughout your career, you will need a valid Georgia driver's license and dependable transportation. Most of the work is in the metro Atlanta area.

Starting pay for an IJ-1 is around \$20,000 per year (plus benefits) and an IJ-8 is close to \$40,000 per year (plus benefits). The yearly pay is based on working 40 hours per week and 50 weeks per year.
